CTE (Career & Technical Education) refers to educational programs that specialize in the skilled trades, applied sciences, modern technologies, and career preparation. Our CTE programs provide students with a range of skills necessary to pursue various career paths, often including hands-on training and practical experiences. These programs are designed to prepare students for direct entry into the workforce, further education, or advanced training in specific career fields to acquire skills relevant to today's job market.

Here are some great updates from our CTE programs across USCD:

- **High School:** Our business teachers have been instrumental in designing our new Business Pathway curriculum, which we're excited to implement for the Fall 2024 school year.
- **High School:** MACNY hosted an information session at Proctor High School to present a pre-apprenticeship program that will begin this month. 13 UCSD students have signed up to participate.
- **Middle School:** Our 7th grade CTE/STEM Expo hosted at SUNY Poly on May 10 will introduce students to high school CTE pathways that will be available to them during their freshman year.
- Elementary: From February-April, several business sponsors, including Wolfspeed, National Grid, Indium, Giotto Enterprises, and Trenton Tech, are helping to support our STEM kit career awareness, culminating with a mini STEM fair for students in collaboration with OHM BOCES School to Careers.
