

Attendance is REQUIRED (state-mandated in Kindergarten for 180 days. Once enrolled in Kindergarten, students are required to attend school regularly with limited missed school days.
Parents/Guardians must contact their child's school nurse. A written excuse is REQUIRED every time your child is ABSENT, TARDY, or to be DISMISSED EARLY.
The first day of school your child will be sent home important notices that must be read to insure you are aware of the school's policies and procedures.
Please take the time to familiarize yourself with these procedures.

- Inform the school nurse if your child requires medication and/has allergies.

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READ TOGETHER:
-One of the best ways to help children learn words is talking and reading constantly and often together

-Share books and stories with vivid pictures
-Read multiple books on the same topic
-Actively listening
-Communication
-Talk to Your Children
-Let child "pretend read" after you finish reading.
-Allow child to retell story or discuss characters, setting, and plot.
-Talk to your child, read to them, sing with them, make up silly rhymes, and play work games

& \text { READ, READ, READ! } \\
& \text { ASK QUESTIONS: }
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-Encourage your child to express themselves. Let them ask questions
-Did you talk about anything you read in class today?
-What new words did you learn from your reading?
-How do you spell them?
-How did you use math today?
-Can you show me an example?
-What math problems did you do today?
-How did you get your answer?
ENCOURAGE LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT:
-Sing songs together
-Rhyme together
-Discuss environment while shopping, traveling, etc.

## PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

-Help develop gross and fine motor skills
-Practice writing name using tripod grip
-Practice using scissors safely together
